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On the plus side, several authors add scholarship and depth. On the other hand, a group approach can affect the whole synthesis of writing. For good and bad, it is printed in two volumes. This makes it easier for pupils to use, but this is even more likely to burden the budget for school textbooks. In this way, the publisher offers a variety of free online resources for both teachers and students. History of the United States, Howard. A People's History of the United States: 1492-2001. HarperCollins.Zinn strives to avoid the history of giants and cover the perspectives of ethnic minorities, immigrants and the poor. Interestingly, it's not a textbook, but many teachers love it because it gives students a fuller and fairer view of the American experience. Few school districts approve of the book, though. For? Because Zinn is relentlessly radical in his views with elements of both socialism and anarchism. Since this is not a popular book to use in school, there are not many supporting materials online. However, the full version of the book is available historyisaweapon.com (Yes, it's actually the name of the website!). The market has a lot of decisions, and it can make the choice of the best AP U.S. textbook history and time-consuming. I hope that these short reviews will provide some guidance for narrowing the choice.
